

Language policy statement at Czestochowa University of Technology

Foreign languages at CUT constitute a crucial element of student education on all three levels of education. The institution ensures teaching of three modern languages: English, German and French.

The number of hours designed for linguistic training and the conditions of passing courses are established by the Faculty Councils of CUT.

On the first-cycle studies each student is obliged to attend the foreign language classes. The linguistic training covers 120 teaching hours, which corresponds to 5 ECTS points. The language course ends with an exam confirming language proficiency at B2 level according to Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), or just with course completion.

On second-cycle studies, students take part in language courses or participate in lectures that are conducted in English by specialists in a given field. After completion of second-cycle studies, students must have, apart from general language competence, skills to use technical language in the scope of their field of study.

On third-cycle studies, students have between 45 and 120 hours of linguistic training. The university requires from the students to be proficient in a foreign language in their scientific and professional environment, as well as other circles.

One of the fixed elements of recruitment process of students interested in mobility within Erasmus+ Programme, are language tests carried out by academic teachers at the Centre of Foreign Languages at CUT. In order to successfully pass the recruitment process, the student is required to pass the language examination at B2 level, or submit a valid language certificate indicating at least B2 level of proficiency.

The institution expects that the foreign students who take part in the mobility within Erasmus+ Programme, know Polish or English language (certain classes are held only in this language), at least at B1+ level, that is, have basic communication skills and know technical and specialist language.

Foreign grant holders who take part in the mobility within Erasmus+ Programme and whose mobility period is longer than 2 months, may attend all the language courses offered by the Centre of Foreign Languages at CUT.
